CPEC: A DECADE OF PROGRESS

Chinese Vice-Premier He Lifeng visited Pakistan from July 30 to August 1 to mark the 10th anniversary of the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC). He met with President Arif Alvi, Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif, and other senior officials to discuss the progress of CPEC and the future of China-Pakistan relations.

He Lifeng is a close aide to Chinese President Xi Jinping and is one of the most powerful figures in the Chinese government. In the past, he has served as minister in charge of the National Development and Reform Commission (NDRC), which is China's top economic planning agency. His visit to Pakistan is a sign of the importance that China attaches to CPEC and Pakistan as a strategic partner.

CPEC is a \$62 billion infrastructure project that aims to connect China's Xinjiang province with the Arabian Sea through Pakistan. It is one of the flagship projects of China's Belt and Road Initiative (BRI).

Throughout his tenure as the chairman of the National Development and Reform Commission, He Lifeng played a pivotal role in the planning and execution of multiple CPEC projects, elevating the initiative to new heights. Under his leadership, China invested nearly \$30 billion over the past decade, primarily focused on energy and infrastructure projects. This substantial investment has not only facilitated the growth of Pakistan's economy but has also forged stronger ties between the two nations.

CPEC, as a pioneering project of the BRI, has achieved remarkable milestones in its ten-year journey. It has successfully established power plants, transformed Gwadar into a strategically significant port, and developed crucial transport infrastructure. These achievements have contributed to Pakistan's economic growth, providing employment opportunities, enhancing energy capacity, and improving connectivity.

In a statement on Twitter, Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif said, "For us, CPEC is not merely a collection of different projects but a symbol of prosperity and shared development. It is a reflection of our relentless fight against poverty, unemployment and underdevelopment."

This project was the result of Chinese President Xi Jinping and Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz's (PML-N) visionary leadership. PML-N's unwavering commitment to the project, its foresight in recognizing the potential of CPEC, and its tireless efforts in ensuring its success have been instrumental in turning

this vision into reality. "I would like to pay rich tributes to President Xi Jinping, and Prime Minister Nawaz Sharif for their pioneering role in conceiving and implementing CPEC as a flagship project of the Belt & Road Initiative," said PM Shehbaz Sharif.

After the groundwork for the project was laid from 2013-2015 during the third tenure of Mian Nawaz Sharif as prime minister, Chinese President Xi Jinping visited Pakistan in 2015 and formalised the CPEC agreement by signing several MOUs with the government of Pakistan.

Under the leadership of PML-N, Pakistan embraced CPEC as a game-changing opportunity to uplift its economy, create jobs, and enhance connectivity. The PML-N government's determination to overcome challenges and propel CPEC forward has set a precedent for effective governance and strategic decision-making.

PML-N, both at the federal and provincial levels, tirelessly worked to create a conducive environment for CPEC's successful implementation. Their proactive engagement with Chinese officials and their dedication to addressing concerns and bottlenecks played a crucial role in advancing the project.

Unfortunately, CPEC came to a near standstill after Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) assumed power in 2018. PTI government's inefficiency and incompetence led to bottlenecks in implementing the multimillion-dollar projects, at a time when Chinese investors were becoming increasingly disinterested in politically correct but otherwise unprofitable projects. Only when the PDM government assumed charge after removing Imran Khan through a vote of no confidence in 2022 that CPEC has seen life returning to it.

During his visit, He Lifeng and the Pakistani leadership discussed the next phase of CPEC. They agreed to focus on the development of special economic zones, industrial parks, and other projects that will create jobs and boost economic growth.

In a statement on Twitter, Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif said, "While the first phase of CPEC was about fixing the 'hardware' side of development, the upcoming second phase will upgrade the 'software' of development by focusing on agriculture, science and technology, skill development, innovation, industrialization, economic growth, health and education."

One of the notable aspects of this visit is the potential for President Xi Jinping's upcoming visit to Pakistan. This anticipated visit reflects the enduring nature of our relationship and heralds a new era of prosperity and development for both countries. Moreover, it emphasizes Pakistan's dedication to fostering a cooperative relationship with powerful nations while avoiding the pitfalls of bloc politics.

Pakistan held several ceremonies in honour of the visiting dignitary. President Dr Arif Alvi conferred the Hilal-i-Pakistan Award on He Lifeng, at a special investiture ceremony, held at Aiwan-e-Sadr in Islamabad.

At a ceremony in Islamabad, the two countries signed six agreements and MOUs in the presence of Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif and Vice Premier of the State Council of China He Lifeng. The government

also hosted a cultural event to commemorate the 10th anniversary of CPEC.

IMRAN MEETS HIS POLITICAL DOOM

Former Prime Minister Imran Khan was convicted by an Islamabad trial court on August 5, 2023, of "corrupt practices" under Section 174 of the Election Act and sentenced to three years in prison along with a fine of Rs100,000.

Imran Khan was arrested from his residence in Lahore and incarcerated in Attock Jail after the court found him guilty of concealing information about gifts he received from foreign dignitaries and selling them for profit.

The case was filed against Khan in August 2022 by

members of the Pakistan Democratic Movement (PDM) for his failure to report the details of Toshakhana gifts in declarations of annual assets submitted to the Election Commission of Pakistan (ECP).

Toshakhana is a government treasury where gifts received by government officials from foreign dignitaries are kept. Khan is accused of keeping three expensive watches gifted to him by foreign leaders and then selling them for hefty profits without declaring the proceeds in his assets and liabilities statement to the ECP.

The ECP launched an inquiry into the allegations against Khan, and in October 2022, it found him guilty of violating the Election Act by making false statements about his assets. The ECP disqualified Khan from holding public office for five years.

The ECP also ordered the reference to be sent to a trial court for the commencement of criminal proceedings against the PTI chairman. In December 2022, the trial court deemed the ECP's request as maintainable and summoned Khan to appear before the court in January 2023.

Imran Khan challenged the ECP decision in the Islamabad High Court (IHC), arguing that he did not break the law by obtaining and selling Toshakhana gifts and that past leaders had also obtained such gifts by paying a small percentage of their assessed value. However, the trial court continued its proceedings.

Meanwhile, as public interest grew in the history of Toshakhana, the government declassified details of Toshakhana gifts received by public office holders from foreign governments and dignitaries since 2002. It also changed rules regarding reporting and retention of gifts by recipients. According to the new rules, only gifts up to \$300 could be retained after due payments as per their assessed market value, while the rest will be displayed at government buildings, donated to charities or auctioned according to the nature of the gift.

Imran Khan's legal team made every effort to get the case dismissed. It first challenged the admissibility of the case in the trial court, but Additional District and Sessions Judge Humayun Dilawar dismissed the petition and indicted Imran Khan on 10 May 2023. Imran Khan's lawyers then challenged the maintainability of the case in IHC. The IHC halted criminal proceedings against Imran Khan and remanded the case back to the trial court on 9 July to re-examine the matter in seven days in the light of eight legal questions to decide the maintainability of the case. On 8 July, the trial court decided that the ECP's petition was maintainable and restarted the criminal proceedings.





Meanwhile, Imran Khan's lawyers approached the Supreme Court on 7 July seeking a stay on the ongoing trial court's proceedings against him in the Toshakhana reference. However, on 3 August the Supreme Court rejected the plea and asked the petitioner to wait for the high court's order, which was deliberating on jurisdiction of the case on Imran Khan's petitions. Also, Supreme Court declined to interfere in the trial court's proceedings.

On August 5, the district and sessions court announced its verdict on the case and ordered Khan's arrest. "He has been found guilty of corrupt practices by hiding the benefits he accrued from national exchequer wilfully and intentionally. He cheated while providing information about gifts he obtained from Toshakhana which later proved to be false and inaccurate. His dishonesty has been established beyond doubt," the court order said.

The court added that it "finds it more than convincing that the complainant [the ECP] has produced confidence inspiring, well knitted and corroborated evidence, and so the charge against the accused [Imran Khan] has successfully been proven that accused has committed offence of corrupt practices by making and

publishing false statements/ declaration in respect of assets acquired by way of gifts from Toshakhana and disposed of during the years 2018-2019, 2019-2020 and making and publishing a false statement and submitting false and incorrect declaration in material particular relating to Form-8 for the year 2020-2021."

It has been proven beyond a shadow of a doubt that Imran Khan has engaged in corrupt practices. The arrest of Khan is a major blow to his political career. He built a following by churning a false narrative of corruption against his opponents while indulging in practices he accused others of. However, his popularity has declined in recent months, and the Toshakhana case has further damaged his reputation.

He could appeal the court's decision, but he is unlikely to succeed. The Toshakhana case is a reminder that even the most powerful politicians are not above the law.

ELECTIONS IN SIGHT

As the general elections are approaching, major political parties are strategising for a win. Aspiring candidates from various political parties have geared up their election campaigns in their respective constituencies and are connecting with the masses. PML-N, being one of the most popular political parties, is also ready to partake in elections based on vision and acumen. Now the question is: will the PML-N again be able to achieve what it achieved in the past as new political

actors have emerged and the political landscape has changed? The age of social media has brought perceptual distortions amongst the youth about traditional political parties and politics has become an all-out battle of emotions rather than rational political actions based on pragmatism.

Since the PDM assumed power after the vote of no confidence in April 2022, it had to face a multitude of challenges, unprecedented in the history of Pakistan. The outgoing PTI deliberately sabotaged the IMF programme to create difficulties for the incoming government, which ultimately impacted the people of Pakistan. Last year's floods incurred a loss of around \$30 billion and unleashed a plethora of problems for the government. The circular debt in the gas sector soared to around Rs1400 billion.

The challenges before the PML-N-led government were immense and seemingly unsurmountable. It was difficult to streamline governance in the face of immense political agitation. LEADING THE WAY

A CONVERSATION WITH SABA SADIQ

In this exclusive interview with Horizon magazine, we sit down with Saba Sadiq, a distinguished senior leader of PML-N and a former member of the Punjab Assembly. Saba Sadiq shares her remarkable journey from a dedicated student leader to a seasoned politician, shedding light on her accomplishments, insights, and aspirations for the party and Pakistan's future.

Horizon: We're delighted to have you for this interview, despite your busy schedule.

Saba Sadiq: The pleasure is mine. As an avid

reader of Horizon, I truly appreciate the dedication of the magazine's team in effectively conveying the party's message to the masses. Rana Mashhood's leadership at the Research and Policy Planning Unit has been instrumental in this effort.

Horizon: Could you provide our readers with an introduction to Saba Sadiq? How would you define yourself?

Saba Sadiq: (With a smile) Saba Sadiq is a proud Pakistani citizen – a law-abiding woman, mother,

wife, and a dedicated social worker. I've had the honour of serving Punjab as a legislator, appointed by the PML-N leadership across four terms.

Horizon: Where were you born? Could you share a bit about your education and family background?

Saba Sadiq: I was born in Lahore in 1966, where I received my primary education. I pursued my LLB and earned a master's in political science from Punjab University. My career in law was complemented by active participation in the Lahore High Court Bar Association. My focus was primarily on family issues and constitutional petitions.

Horizon: Your journey into politics is intriguing. How did you enter the realm of politics?

Saba Sadiq: My entry into politics was inspired by my father's interaction with Mian Nawaz Sharif, both being from the business community. Guided by my father, I became involved with the Muslim Student Federation during college, where leaders like Khawaja Saad Rafique and Mian Shehbaz Sharif mentored me. From the outset, I understood that politics is a means to serve the people.

I fondly recall the era when our political mentor and Chief Minister of Punjab, Ghulam Haider Wyne, would rest on a traditional "baan charpai" at the Muslim League House while actively organising the party. He maintained an open-door policy for all workers, making himself accessible to every single one. I have personally experienced his candid guidance, and despite moments of admonishment, he remained an exceptional mentor, always within the reach of the party members. This period marked a golden era for our party, witnessing a substantial surge in membership. The strength of our primary units at the union council level was remarkable, leading to a time when bureaucrats treated our members with respect and earnestly addressed their concerns. It was during this phase that I assumed the role of a councillor in the Metropolitan Corporation, Lahore (MCL), shortly after graduating from law school. Within this capacity, I served on the education committee, proudly contributing to reform initiatives



within MCL schools.

Horizon: Reflecting on your political career, you've been a prominent figure in the Punjab Assembly. Could you share your experiences?

Saba Sadiq: My journey as a PML-N representative in the Punjab Assembly commenced in 2002 and continued through subsequent assemblies in 2008, 2013, and 2018. Under the guidance of our party leadership, I've played a role in significant initiatives, especially those focused on women legislators. The inception of the Women's Parliamentary Caucus stands out, with the first meeting hosted at my residence.

INTERVIEW

Horizon: Women's representation has been a key aspect. How has the environment for women in the assembly evolved?

Saba Sadiq: In 2002, women's perspectives faced limited acceptance, but over time, women began asserting their views based on their competence. While societal tolerance for outspoken women remains low, the appointment of Maryam Nawaz as senior vice president and chief organiser has positively influenced the PML-N's internal environment. Women's engagement at all levels has improved under her leadership. She is also actively promoting the youth.

Horizon: Transitioning to your role as an MPA, could you elaborate on your contributions?

Saba Sadiq: I played a pivotal role in establishing a women's caucus within the Punjab Assembly, a forum that advocated for women's issues and engaged in parliamentary debates. Notable achievements of PML-N during the 2013-2018 tenure include introducing comprehensive gender reforms and passing a landmark anti-violence bill. Additionally, I served on the Public Accounts Committee and advised the chief minister on social welfare matters. My tenure as the chairperson of Punjab's Child Protection and Welfare Bureau marked a deeply rewarding period of my life.

Horizon: Your tenure at the Child Protection Bureau has been lauded. Could you share your experiences?

Saba Sadiq: My role as chairperson was transformative. Despite initial reservations, I found the work immensely noble. Recently Rizwana's case





has been highlighted, but there are hundreds of such cases all around us, cases of domestic abuse, child labour, and sex trafficking. I led efforts to combat these heinous crimes. Equipping officers with modern tools, collaborating with the Police and Pakistan Railways, and fostering cross-province and cross-border collaborations were some notable achievements. We succeeded in rescuing several victims of domestic abuse, child labour and sex trafficking, and traced families of runaway children. The welfare of children remains an area of immense pride for me.

Horizon: Shifting to the current political landscape, what's your analysis?

Saba Sadiq: The current challenges trace back to the unjust disqualification of Mian Nawaz Sharif. PML-N leadership was unfairly targeted to obstruct Pakistan's progress. They were implicated on false charges but Alhamdulillah, not a single penny's corruption could be proved in courts, reinforcing our leadership's integrity.

Unfortunately, after PTI assumed charge, Pakistan's economy started declining and the country was brought to the brink of default. It was PML-N that rescued Pakistan by getting IMF to agree to a stand-by arrangement. PTI's extreme position and holier-than-

thou attitude resulted in the unfortunate incidents of 9 May. These incidents must have pleased Pakistan's enemies because, until now, no patriotic Pakistani could even think of attacking the Pakistan Army.


Horizon: Balancing work and personal life can be challenging. How do you manage?




